COURSE DESCRIPTION: Medical terminology is the study of the principles of medical word building to help the student develop the extensive medical vocabulary used in health care occupations. Students receive a thorough grounding in basic medical terminology through a study of root words, prefixes and suffixes.

COURSE GOALS AND/OR OBJECTIVES: Upon completion of HSC3537, you will be able to:

- List suffixes, prefixes, and word roots common to medical terminology

- Define suffixes, prefixes, and word roots common to medical terminology
- Construct medical terms correctly using the appropriate suffixes, prefixes, and word roots
- List suffixes, prefixes, and word roots common to specific organ systems of the human body
- Construct system specific medical terms using the correct suffixes, prefixes, and word roots

INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS: The instructional methods used in this course include: video lectures, flashcards, self-testing quizzes, a midterm, and a final.

1. *Introductory activities* (15 points total)- The syllabus quiz and discussion will help you get orientated to the course.
2. *Flashcards* (65 points total)- Each module has flashcards of the key medical terminology (prefixes, suffixes, root terms, etc.) to help you learn.
3. *Worksheets* (65 points total)- Each module has a worksheet that will get you to practice building medical terminology.
4. *Weekly Module Quizzes* (260 points total) – Each module has a quiz with multiple choice, true/false, matching, and/or labeling questions. You may take each module quiz twice and your highest score is the one recorded.
5. *Medical Terminology Communication Activities* (45 points total) – There were be short, fun activities in some modules that will get you interacting with the medical terminology you are learning.
6. *A mid-term examination* (100 points). The exam will be on Canvas, and will be proctored through Honorlock. It will cover the first six modules.
7. *A final, cumulative (all chapters) examination* (125 points). The exam will be on Canvas, and will be proctored through Honorlock. It will cover all module content.

HONORLOCK:

Honorlock will proctor your exams this semester. Honorlock is an online proctoring service that allows you to take your exam from the comfort of your home. You DO NOT need to create an account, download software or schedule an appointment in advance. Honorlock is available 24/7 and all that is needed is a computer, a working webcam, and
