



**Assistant/Associate Professor (Two Positions)**  
**University of Florida - Department of Health Education & Behavior**

The Department of Health Education & Behavior at the University of Florida seeks to hire two tenure-track faculty members at the Assistant or Associate Professor rank. Candidates with research interests in electronic and digital health, health disparities, and/or global health are desired. These positions are 9-month, full-time (1.0 FTE), tenure accruing positions beginning August 2012 with an opportunity to supplement salary through external funding and/or summer teaching.

The Department of Health Education & Behavior (<http://www.hhp.ufl.edu/heb>) enrolls approximately 350 undergraduate and 50 masters and doctoral students, and currently has 14 full-time faculty members. The Department recently established a new Center for Digital Health and Wellness (<http://hhp.ufl.edu/heb/cdhw>). As a member of the American Association of Universities, the University of Florida is one of the nation's major public research universities and the College of Health and Human Performance was recently ranked as a top ten program in the National Research Council's Assessment of Research-Doctorate Programs in the US. Therefore, the Department seeks individuals who will contribute to advancing scholarship, grant funding, and graduate education.

Candidates must possess an earned doctorate in health education, promotion, communication, behavior, or other appropriately-related field. The successful candidate must have a strong record of scholarly accomplishments, including impactful research publications, success or significant promise in obtaining extramural research funding, experience with graduate education and mentoring, and evidence of strong teaching skills. Applicants must have excellent communication skills along with a commitment to integrity, diversity, collaboration, professional service, and academic excellence. An applicant's record of including diverse backgrounds, experiences, races, ethnicities, genders, and perspectives in research, teaching and service is factored favorably.

The University of Florida is located in Gainesville, a city of approximately 250,000 residents in North-Central Florida, 85 miles from the Georgia border, 50 miles from the Gulf of Mexico, and 67 miles from the Atlantic Ocean. It has abundant wildlife, mature forests, prairies, lakes, and opportunities for many outdoor activities, with moderate temperatures almost all year round. Gainesville has an excellent school system, with a number of public schools ranked highly in the state and nation.

Salary and rank are commensurate with experience.
