We are seeking interns who are flexible and able to adapt to change and working environments. In addition, this internship seeks reliable and motivated individuals who enjoy working with children, parents, and public health officials.

School based influenza immunization programs (SBIIP) offer much promise for controlling flu pandemics. Schools facilitate virus transmission because they are extremely effective virus exchange systems and children are "super spreaders", they shed more of the virus and do so for a longer period of time than do adults.

In the fall on 2009, Alachua County was able to immunize in excess of 66% of all children grades pre K – 8th with seasonal flu vaccine. It is the highest flu immunization rate in the state, and very possibly the nation. Our community base includes the Alachua County Health Department (ACHD), Alachua County Public Schools (ACPS) faculty and students from the University of Florida and our 20+ community partners.

Our team is now busy planning next year's immunization program, and we're looking forward to building on this year's success. We are seeking highly motivated and self directed interns to assist in running Alachua County's school based program. In addition to gaining valuable "hands on" public health experience and directing public health interventions - there are opportunities for publication in an academic journal.

Our program's goals are to:

- 1. Continue to achieve immunization rates in the range of 70% for Alachua County Pre-K-8 grade public and private school children.
- 2. Begin to integrate the program into high schools in Alachua County.

We are seeking interns to help organize and assist in implementing the SBIIP. The interns will be responsible for and in charge of assisting at least 3 schools throughout the county with their program. This will provide the intern a unique opportunity to gain "hands on" public health experience, leadership skills, and the ability to plan, implement, and evaluate an intervention in one semester.

This internship is best suited for those who are flexible and able to adapt to changing tasks and working environments. Duties often include working in the schools and at school related events (which sometimes occur during the evenings/weekends). In addition, this internship seeks reliable and motivated individuals who enjoy working with children, parents, and public health officials.
