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UF Health *Internship Opportunities*

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Application Process

- Applications will only be accepted online.
- Students may select up to 4 departments of interest
 - PLEASE NOTE: Due to the high volume of requests for pediatric and mother-baby locations, it is recommended that you choose from a variety of specialties. The Peds and Mother-Baby Units can only take a few interns. They screen all the applications and then select a few top candidates.
 - If you do not pick some adult locations, you may not be contacted or get placed at all.
- Submit your resume and cover letter to the survey link below.
 - Explain in your cover letter why you are a good candidate for each selected department. A brief paragraph per department is sufficient.

About Perinatal Units

Perinatal pertains to the period immediately before and after birth. The perinatal units at UF Health Shands include the Labor & Delivery Unit, Mother/Baby Unit, and Neonatal Intensive Care Unit.

Labor & Delivery Unit

The Labor & Delivery Unit is where mothers deliver their babies. This unit also provides antepartum care to expecting mothers.

Mother/Baby Unit

The Mother/Baby Unit specializes in the care of postpartum women, as well as stable neonates.

Neonatal Intensive Care Unit

The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit is the unit for newborn babies who need specialized medical attention.

Potential Perinatal Unit Internship Supervisors

Within each of the perinatal units there are clinical leaders, a unit manager, and one clinical nurse specialist for all three units. All of these are possible internship supervisors.

What Interns Do

Essentially, interns do similar tasks for all three units but with a different patient population.

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Emergency Departments

Student roles vary and include developing staff education materials, assist with patient education projects, assist with quality/regulatory audits.

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Adult Intensive Care Units

Student placement opportunities exist in various adult intensive care units:

- Burn Unit
- Medical ICU
- Trauma ICU
- Neuro-intensive care
- Cardiac Intensive Care
- Surgical Intensive Care
- Thoracic Intensive Care

Student roles vary and include developing staff education materials, assist with patient education projects, assist with quality/regulatory audits.



Medical-Surgical Nursing Units

There are several Medical-Surgical Units in the hospital. Students assist with:

- Patient education
- Assist with the development of staff education materials, in-services, and seminars
- Data collection, data entry and literature searches to support quality improvement and research projects.
- Projects to facilitate resolution of complex patient care issues, e.g. pain, safety.
- Participation in multidisciplinary groups to look at problem solving for issues that impact patient

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Operating Rooms and Post Anesthesia Care Units (PACU)



There are three Operating Room Areas and three PACUs

- North Tower
- Cancer Hospital
- Heart, Vascular, Neuromedicine Hospital

 Interns will assist the unit management team with regulatory compliance within the Operating Room or the PACU

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Diabetes Education

Assist inpatient diabetes educator in teaching (includes handouts, pictures, booklets and videos) diabetes self management skills to patients and families.

Topics may include:

- Basic nutrition and blood sugar target ranges
- Short- & long-term complications
- Sick days
- Skin/foot care
- Exercise



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PICC (IV Therapy) Team

Peripherally Inserted Central Catheters for IV therapy (PICC)

- Update patient education materials; Encourage use of EMMI
- Update staff education materials, including development of newsletters
- Track patients who received PICC lines (for possible complications and trials of new products)
- Survey patients and staff on satisfaction with PICC program to make improvements
- $^{\circ}\,$ Research for funds for equipment



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Palliative and Supportive Care Consult Service

Assist with Palliative care program for adult and pediatrics at UF Health.

Assist with setting up staff education

Assist with organizing/updating division web page

Updating patient and staff education materials

Assist with research for grant/philanthropic opportunities

Coordination of bereavement list/mailings to families

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Skin and Wound Team

Student duties include:

- Help develop patient education for patients, family and staff.
- Data entry for pressure injury prevalence
- Attend meetings and shadow the wound care team.
- Organize wound care ostomy cart and office , if needed
- Answer team phone effectively
- Education of staff, patients in ostomy care and pressure injury prevention
- Assist with the analysis of facility acquired pressure injuries



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Transplant

- Pediatric and Adult Heart/Lung Transplant
- Kidney/Pancreas Transplant
 - Assist in the development of various patient/family education materials
 - Assist with education of patients/families before and after transplant.
 - Identify and develop new learning methodologies for patients.
 - Assist with data input (obtaining outpatient labs, updating patient charts with clinical information, etc.).
 - Along with the site supervisor, see patients in clinic for weekly visits.





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Clinical Nurse Specialists

- ➤ Participation in patient/family educational process through developing, revising, obtaining patient/family educational materials, conducting surveys and interviews, and evaluating outcomes.
- Participation in data collection, data entry, and literature searches to support quality improvement and research
- >Assist with regulatory requirements for the health science center.
- Assist with the development of projects to help resolve complex patient care issues (pain, end-of-life, suicide, safety, co-morbidities, IV access, wound care, care of the elderly)
- Participate in multidisciplinary groups to problem solve issues that impact patient care.



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Nursing Education

- Assist education specialists with program development and coordination of Nursing and Support Staff Orientation, Medical Surgical Nursing, Pediatrics, Critical Care, Mother- Baby, and Trauma courses
- Conduct literature searches to support courses being developed
- Work with preceptor to develop/design continuing education programs
- Assist with data analysis of programs, prepare charts and reports
- Teach some basic skills and assist with skill validations
- Assist with creation of staff and patient education materials
- Assist with planning conferences, seminars and education fairs
- · Participate in clinical meetings



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Nursing Informatics

Assist with the implementation of EPIC and other information systems.

Assist with development of computer programs for nurses.

- Present changes to Nursing staff
- Assist with computer education of Nursing staff

Assist with creation of staff and patient education materials

Assist with planning conferences, seminars and education fairs

Participate in clinical meetings

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Nursing Quality and Magnet Programs

Assist with data collection related to Magnet Designation

Assist with regulatory audits for the UF Health Nursing department

Assist with data collection, data entry and analyses (patient care errors; pain management; fall prevention; medication errors; pressure ulcer prevention; infections).

Conduct mock JCAHO/Magnet unit surveys with staff to identify issues and provide real-time education to staff members.

Develop educational materials, or staff presentations related to identified quality initiatives (restraint use; falls; pain; medication error reduction, etc.).

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Trauma Program

Students work with trauma program coordinators and:

- Assist with regulatory compliance/audits for trauma services
- Assist with development of educational programs related to trauma
- Assist with data entry and tracking of trauma education

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Case Management/Social Work

Students will work with the education specialist in the case management/social work department to design education programs for patients and staff.



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UF Health: Intern Requirements

The UF Health intern requirements MUST be fully completed and submitted to Dr. Moses no later than the last day of class (HSC4800). These requirements are REQUIRED (the requirements are not optional).

Gather official copies of ALL requirements.

Place in order as listed on the checklist.

The first page MUST be the <u>UF Health Internship Requirements</u> checklist.

TYPE your full name, email, and date of birth (month/day/year) at the top.

Scan all paperwork into one PDF file.

Upload to the PDF file to the <u>Internship Site Specific Requirements</u> assignment folder in Canvas (HSC4800).

These requirements are due by the LAST day of class (see HSC4800 schedule).

UF Health Intern Requirements:

The below requirements are mandatory for ALL internships within the UF Health system.

Requirements MUST be submitted to Canvas no later than the last day of class (see HSC4800 course schedule).

Submit one PDF file that includes professionally prepared copies of each requirement (combine files in the order shown below).

NOTE: this page should represent the cover page and first page of the PDF file.

1. General health screening and/or physical examination

Completed "well check" from a clinician verifying student's ability to complete assigned internship duties. Proof includes a signed letter from the clinician (see the Healthcare Provider Statement of Medical Capability form).

2. Immunization Record (Official copy)

2a. MMR vaccine

Immunization record that provides: Documentation of two MMR vaccines administered 4 weeks apart, OR Laboratory (serological) proof of immunity to measles and rubella.

2b. Documentation of immunity to Chickenpox (varicella)

Immunization record that provides: Documentation of two varicella vaccinations, administered 8 weeks apart, OR Laboratory (serological) proof of immunity, OR Documentation of a history of varicella disease or herpes zoster ("shingles") by a licensed healthcare provider.

2c. Hepatitis B vaccine

Immunization record that provides: Documentation of completion of hepatitis B vaccine series; OR Documentation of Hepatitis B surface antibody serology (optional, but recommended); OR Declination of Hepatitis 8 vaccination completed.

2d. Tetanus/Diphtheria/Pertussis (Tdap) vaccine

Immunization record that provides: Documentation of Tdap vaccination. If 10 or more years has passed since the Tdap vaccination was administered, a Tdap booster is required.

3. COVID-19 vaccine ***not required, but highly recommended ***

Provide proof of administration of and completed series of the COVID-19 vaccine if you have it.

4. Flu vaccine

Proof of administration of the current season's quadrivalent formulation of the flu vaccine.

5. Tuberculosis screening (PPD)

Documentation of a negative tuberculin skin test (PPD) or negative TB –IGRA blood test within 12 months of start of clinical rotation. If history of previous testing was positive, there must be documentation of (1) a chest x-ray showing no active tuberculosis disease, and (2) completion of preventative therapy or treatment for active tuberculosis disease.

Note: documentation of the administered test AND the final results are required.

6. Proof of Health insurance coverage

Provide proof of your health insurance coverage. Scan the front and back of card into a single PDF file and include in the packet. Note: If you do not have health insurance, you may not intern at UF Health Shands Hospital.

7. Completed training course on HIV and AIDS, as required by Florida Law.

HIV/AIDS Education for Healthcare Workers - Visit https://mytraining-ufshands.sumtotal.host/ and sign-up for the HIV/AIDS Education for Healthcare Workers course. Include the certificate of completion (PDF) in the packet.

8. UF Health HIPPA training: https://privacy.ufl.edu/privacy-training/hipaa-training/ Include the certificate of completion (PDF) in the packet.

9. BLS Healthcare Provider Certification

Include the certificate of completion (PDF) in the packet.

10. Criminal background check

Visit https://web.fdle.state.fl.us/search/app/default and complete the Computerized Criminal History search (\$25). Save the online search results (sent via email) into a single PDF file and include in the packet.
