## Greetings UF Instructors,

As we move classes online, the Disability Resource Center is available to support you on how to facilitate accommodations in an online setting. Our expertise is within the scope of creating accessible and inclusive learning experiences for our students. As such, you can count on our support as some of you navigate this new terrain.

We have a strong partnership with the Center for Teaching Excellence who will also be a resource for you. We have already sent them a list of instructors who have students with nuanced testing accommodations enrolled in their course. They will prioritize your inquiries and be able to assist with specific questions.

It is important that students with disabilities are able to access their accommodations online so they do not have to remain on campus. Instructors are responsible for ensuring accommodations are met in classes, assignments and exams. Fortunately, the majority of accommodations can be facilitated in Canvas or through other technologies. For example, if a student has an accommodation of additional time for exams, instructors will be able to add extra time in Canvas for those students.
