Dual Degree

Eligibility – For a student to be considered for a dual degree, the following criteria must be met accordingly:

- Have demonstrated a well-articulated educational goal for which the dual degree is appropriate and/or necessary.
- Have between 45 and 96 hours (excluding AP, IB, dual enrollment, or overseas study credit).
- Have at least a 3.0 UF GPA at the time the application is submitted.
- Meet all critical tracking requirements for the major requested.
- Meet all other college progression standards for both majors and demonstrate potential for success in both majors.
- Be able to complete the degree within the appropriate time frame listed below:
- For students admitted as freshman to UF: 140 hours or 8 semesters (not including summers) without exceeding the maximum credit hours per semester. (Excludes AP/IB and Dual Enrollment courses)
- For students admitted as transfer to UF: 70 hours or 4 semesters (not including summers) without exceeding the maximum credit hours per semester. (Excludes AP/IB and Dual Enrollment courses not needed for HHP program)

Combination Degree (Offered only to residential students)

The B.S./M.S. combined degree program allows qualified students to earn both a Bachelor's and Master's degree from the Department of Sport Management with 12 credits of graduate coursework counting towards both degrees. This program allows students to complete both degrees within a five-year time period instead of the usual six years. At this time, this program is only available to students in the in-person Sport Management program. *Interested students should meet with an academic advisor early in their undergraduate career to determine eligibility.*

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Admission Criteria for the Combination Degree

- Complete Critical Tracking courses with a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Complete the following courses with a B or better on the first attempt:
 - SPM2000 Introduction to Sport Management
 - MAN3025 Principles of Management
 - EME2040 or CGS2531 Intro to Ed Tech or Problem Solving Using Computer Software
 - SPM3012 Social Issues in Sport
 - MAR3023 Principles of Marketing
- Maintain a UF GPA of 3.2 or higher
- Meet with an Academic Advisor to ensure eligibility
- Submit the SPM Combined Degree Application before the spring of Junior year.
- *The combination degree is offered only to residential students; UF Online students are not eligible.

Meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission to the program.
