COURSE DESCRIPTION

This online, asynchronous course introduces exercise psychology by discussing topics including the effects of exercise on psychological well-being, exercise adherence, and intervention from both the theoretical and applied perspectives.

- explain and analyze scientific protocols utilized in exercise psychology research, common interventions, and scientific evidence that seeks to explain the relationship between physical activity, psychological factors, and exercise behaviors.
- evaluate case studies, retrieve and apply quality research, and create action plans by which the knowledge gained from this course can be used to support behavior change by promoting physical activity and exercise engagement.
- Present the knowledge gained in critical, constructive, and diplomatic academic discussions and effective written communication of scientific knowledge in exercise psychology.

Grading

Evaluation Components

- Perusall Assignments: Collaborative, online Perusall assignments will be used to encourage active reading, critical thinking, and discussion of assigned journal articles and book chapters.
- Projects: Students will design and apply exercise psychology research to various assignments, gaining hands-on experience in research methods, data collection and analysis, and presenting findings.
- Quizzes: At the start of the semester and within each module, students will take online, open-note quizzes aimed at gauging student understanding of content and enhancing engagement in learning opportunities.
- Discussions: Online discussions will be used to promote active engagement with course concepts and enable students to share perspectives and learn from each other.
- Surveys: Anonymous surveys will be conducted throughout the semester to collect student feedback, assess understanding, and make adjustments to better address the learning needs of the class.
